### HANSEN'S DISEASE CLUB ACTIVITY REPORT JANUARY TO MARCH 2022


## 1. DISTRIBUTION OF REMAINING FREE MEDICATIONS FOR LEPROSY PATIENTS

### Objectives:


 To be able to distribute free advocacy materials to all our leprosy patients that will help in raising awareness that leprosy is indeed curable.


### 3. WORLD LEPROSY DAY - January 30, 2022

### Objective:

- To provide the basic knowledge in mycology that is necessary for all dermatologist.
- To instruct on the proper specimen collection for KOH examination
- To demonstrate the techniques of KOH smear preparation
- To educate on how to read and interpret the KOH smear under the microscope

### Description of Activity:

- The speakers gave 3-part lectures on mycology with emphasis on the laboratory and diagnostics involved in such field.
- The medical technologist gave a lecture on KOH test procedure followed by actual demonstration of techniques and proper specimen collection from different anatomic locations. She also elucidated on how to read and interpret the findings in KOH smear.

### Output:

- The dermatology residents gained new learnings and was able to solidify their knowledge on Mycology through a 2-part post-lecture tests.
- The dermatology residents were also given the opportunity to learn on how to do KOH testing as well as the interpretation of its results.

#### 7. TELEDERMATOLOGY

#### Objective:

 To provide online consultations to leprosy patients from far-flung areas who do not have access to transportation or has difficulty in seeking face-to-face consult.

patients are also assessed and encouraged to seek consult at the OPD if
highly suspected as a new case of leprosy.
