Background:

NCR was at Alert level 2 for the 1st half of the month with low risk(for transmission) classification but due to increase in the number of Covid -19 cases for the remaining half of the month, alert status was elevated to level 3. Under the alert level classification, suspension of Face to face consultation at OPD was suspended and limitation of patient care activities were also observed. Strict observance of minimum health protocols was again reiterated. Thus for the health setting the Public Health, Emerging Disease and Wellness Unit submits its accomplishment report as follows;
