YEAR 2020  
July-September 2020**

**1. TELEDERMATOLOGY**

- **Objective:**
  - To provide online consultations among leprosy patients from far-flung areas who do not have access to transportation
  - To reduce leprosy relapse and resistance to multidrug therapy
- **Description of Activity:**
  - The dermatology residents provide free online consultation to leprosy patients from remote areas who are unable to have face-to-face consults at the OPD. New patients are also assessed and encouraged to seek consult at the OPD if highly suspected as a new case of leprosy.
- **Output:**
  - The patients are able to undergo regular follow-up online consultations to address their medical concerns.
- **Expenses:**
  - None

**2. REGULAR OUTPATIENT DEPARTMENT CONSULTATION**

- **Objectives:**
  - To provide regular consultation with leprosy patients
  - To distribute medications among leprosy patients and prevent drug resistance
  - To strengthen patient and community awareness on leprosy
- **Description of Activity:**
  - The infectious clinic is open to patients during weekdays, 8 am to 5 pm despite the community quarantine to ensure that patients have easy access to consults and medications. The dermatology residents provide face-to-face consultations to patients who seek consult at the clinic.
- **Output:**
  - The leprosy patients are able to have follow-up consultations and get their medications on a regular basis. Lepra reaction kits and starter kits were distributed to patients.
- **Expenses:**
  - None

**3. ACTIVE GROUP CHAT PARTICIPATION**

- **Objectives:**
  - To provide moral and emotional support to leprosy patients
  - To boost the support group system among 90 members of the HD club chat group

- **Description of Activity:**
  - The consultants, residents, and paramedical staff from the infectious core team are able to regularly communicate with leprosy patients beyond consultation hours to provide moral and emotional; support.
- **Output:**
  - The patients are able to address their concerns directly to the residents, consultants, and paramedical staff of the infectious core team. They are also able to maintain constant communication to gain insight from other group members.
- **Expenses:**
  - None

#### 4. DISTRIBUTION OF STARTER KITS AND LEPRA REACTION KITS FOR LEPROSY PATIENTS

- **Objectives:**
  - To be able to provide assistance to newly diagnosed patients and those experiencing lepra reaction by giving them medications which can help them boost their immunity and fight their disease
